What is CLO?

The Community Living Options (CLO) Program offers services for high-functioning individuals with a developmental disability: i.e. autism, cerebral palsy, epilepsy and cognitive disability that receive minimal or no Federal & State support services.

CLO brings together consumers, community volunteers and other resources to provide support for individuals needing more assistance in the community.
