Ability360 is the largest Center for Independent Living in Arizona.

Our Mission

Ability360 is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization offering and promoting programs designed to empower people with disabilities to take personal responsibility, so that they may achieve or continue to live independent lifestyles within the community.

Our Work

The United States is home to over 400 Centers for Independent Living (CIL)s, each of which offers five core services: Information & Referral, Advocacy, Independent Living Skills Training, Peer Mentoring and Transition. As a CIL, Ability360 offers these five core services and provides a wide range of additional programs to address aspects of independent living.

The Ability360 Center

Ability360 owns and operates both the Ability360 Center, where it is co-located with other disability service organizations, and the Ability360 Sports & Fitness Center.

The Ability360 Center is a 62,000-square-foot universally designed, accessible and transit-oriented non-profit resource center that serves as a model for accessible design and collaborative programming. Located in the heart of Phoenix at 50th Street and Washington, the Ability360 Center is a hub for uniting those with common goals to improve the lives of people with disabilities, hosting numerous events each year.

Home Care Services

Ability360’s Home Care Services offers compassionate, high-quality, non-medical home and community-based support to individuals with disabilities, seniors, and their caregivers. This program promotes self-determination and independence within the community.

This critical service has been providing nationally recognized in-home care for over 25 years, emphasizing the holistic well-being of individuals and their independence. We recruit, train, and employ caregivers to provide personal assistance services to qualified individuals through AHCCCS (Medicaid) and Division of Developmental Disabilities funding.

Ability360 Sports & Fitness Center

Welcome to Arizona's epicenter of adaptive sports, recreation, and fitness for individuals with disabilities and their families. The Ability360 Sports & Fitness Center is not just exceptional; it's the only one of its kind in the southwest United States. We take pride in pushing boundaries, leading the way in accessible sports and fitness programs.

Unmatched Accessibility

Our 45,000-square-foot Sports & Fitness Center is specifically designed to cater to the unique needs of individuals with disabilities. The Sports & Fitness Center features accessible weights, cardiorespiratory machines, multi-purpose courts, a climbing wall, an indoor track, an aquatic center with a lap pool, therapy pool, and spa.

Adaptive Sports & Fitness

From hosting international adaptive sports competitions and adaptive outdoor activities to daily fitness classes, our Sports & Fitness Center is the go-to place for so many. Paralympians, past and current military members, seniors, youth and their families are welcomed. We strive to provide an inclusive environment.

Telephone Pioneer Park

Ability360 offers activities at Telephone Pioneer Park, which is located north of 19th Avenue and Bell Road in Phoenix. Activities at the park include: group fitness classes, recreational therapy sessions, sports clinics, archery and special events for youth and families.

Employment Services

With Ability360’s employment-related programming, people with disabilities receive guidance with support at various stages of their workforce journey, whether they are reentering the workforce, starting work for the first time, or preparing for career changes.

Benefits 2 Work AZ

Arizona’s Work Incentives Planning & Assistance Program (WIPA) assists individuals receiving Social Security disability benefits who wish to return to work. 1,019 Social Security Administration beneficiaries were empowered to understand the impact of earned income.

360Youth

360Youth is our Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS) program for students ages 14-22. The program assists students in finding employment and preparing for a career after high school. 95 students completed Pre-ETS.

Employment Services

Ability360 helps people with disabilities prepare for, find, and succeed in employment. Through individualized career counseling, job search support, and ongoing guidance, people reach their work goals while understanding how employment affects their benefits. A total of 16 new individuals were enrolled in Ability360 employment services through the Ticket to Work program.

PROGRAMS & SERVICES

Home Modifications

The Ability360 Home Modification program assists seniors and individuals with disabilities in Maricopa and Pinal counties who need to modify their homes for accessibility and safety.

The Arizona Long Term Care System, Community Development Block Grants and foundations are primarily used to fund home modifications for low-to-moderate-income residents. A range of essential modifications are offered in the program including but not limited to: ramps, widened doorways, grab bars, sinks, toilets, roll-in showers, and light switch relocation. These modifications promote independence to help seniors and people with disabilities thrive in the community.

Advocacy Services

Advocacy in Action

Our Advocacy programs help ignite self-advocacy and promote independent living principles for individuals with disabilities. We create learning opportunities that foster peer support, self-determination, and personal development. By promoting involvement in the legislative process, providing training, and building coalitions, we empower individuals to lead more independent lives. We work to educate and engage our community members on policy and system-change efforts to further disability inclusion and awareness.

Disability awareness training is critical for businesses and organizations to successfully engage and serve the disability community. We trained 627 individuals to increase their awareness and understanding of best practice language and etiquette.

Empowering Workshops

We hosted 25 advocacy and community resource workshops, engaging 333 participants on vital topics such as healthcare, transportation, legislative advocacy, voter registration, and civil rights.

Self-Advocacy Training

We empowered 235 Division of Developmental Disabilities members through our “This is MY Life” program, promoting self-advocacy and self-determination.

PROGRAMS & SERVICES

Independent Living Programs & Services

We offer a range of programs focused on providing opportunities for individuals seeking to live a more independent lifestyle.

Reintegration to Community

111 people with new disabilities were able to receive peer support, resources and information while they completed their rehabilitation. 3 people successfully moved back into the community from long-term care facilities.

Independent Living Skills

72 people received one-on-one personal assessments to create steps for personal goals to increase their self-reliance and self-confidence.

Peer Mentoring

49 Peer Mentors provided over 2,142 hours of support, guidance, and encouragement by sharing their experiences to others with disabilities.

Voting Rights

The week of September 8, 2025, was recognized as Disability Voting Rights Week. The nationwide event encouraged individuals with disabilities to vote, update their voter registration, and raise awareness about the existing barriers that may prevent them from making their voice heard in the election process.

In recognition of this week, Ability360 hosted an event on Monday, September 8 in partnership with Maricopa County Elections that welcomed individuals with disabilities to come together to understand their voting rights and accessible voting. Attendees were able to partake in demonstrations on how to use accessible voting devices and ask questions they may have about voting in Maricopa County.

Angelica Bland, the Communications Coordinator for the voter outreach team at Maricopa County Elections, provided education on the services that they provide for people with disabilities and a hands-on demonstration of the election equipment that voters will find at the Vote Centers.

“We have multiple voting options for our voters in Maricopa County, whether that’s early voting and they want to request our special elections board, or our large-print ballot, or our braille ballots, those are the early voting services we offer,” Bland said. “We also offer our in-person voting services as well, such as our curbside voting and our accessible voting devices found at every one of our locations in Maricopa County.”

For in-person voting, accessible devices may include a large touch screen tablet where users can adjust the settings to their needs. The tablet includes a controller containing braille buttons for those who may be unable to access the touch screen, as well as a headset to be used as an audio component for those who may be unable to read the screen.

“A lot of our community members do not realize these voting accommodations are available to them,” April Reed, Ability360 Vice President of Advocacy, said. “We want them to be empowered and understand that these accommodations are here for you and you can use them anytime you need them.”



The event allowed individuals to try the voting devices to allow themselves to be comfortable when it is time to cast their vote. All voting booths are protected by privacy screens so every voter can feel confident and secure in their vote.

The event was designed to not only inform community members of the tools that are accessible for them but to reduce any stress related to any past challenges they may have experienced when voting. Both the presentation and demonstration serve as a reminder that every vote counts.

Attendee of the event, Jenny Cosgrove, shared her experience in exercising her rights when it comes to voting and how her disability does not change the value of her vote.

“We are the people whose voices are most ignored, so we have to be loud and give them our voices.” Cosgrove said. “It’s vital for us to share what we need and why we matter, and that our differences do not mean anything bad, it just means that we are different.”

Debbie and Kaitlyn Andre

The Importance of Family Caregiving

Being a full-time teacher, a caregiver and mother are all very rewarding things to do, but can quickly become overwhelming. Debbie Andre knows this all too well, as this was her position just a few years ago.

Now, Andre cares for her 19-year-old daughter Kaitlyn Andre who has spina bifida. The Division of Developmental

Disabilities (DDD) program offers Debbie the opportunity to become a caregiver at Ability360, which allows her the emotional and financial freedom to care for her daughter, while helping to lower her stress of balancing so much at once.

“Juggling Kaitlyn’s medical care needs, appointments, therapy and a profession

was very challenging,” Debbie said. She was also left wondering what she would do about work in the morning whenever Kaitlyn would wake up with high fevers or other critical health problems that required immediate attention. These factors, among other reasons, influenced her to make the decision to leave her job as a special education teacher and become Kaitlyn’s caretaker full-time. While this was a good decision, it presented some financial stress on the family. When Debbie heard of Ability360’s caregiving services, she jumped on the opportunity.

“We do a lot with the recreational side of Ability360, and I love working with their staff and how they respect this community,” Debbie said.

“Finding out that I could be the one to take care of her was a great fit for our family,” she added.

The benefits of becoming a DDD caregiver More than 50,000 Arizonans use DDD, which provides care to those diagnosed with various disabilities. DDD services are personalized to ensure each person gets the services they need. The Andre family was able to utilize DDD services and make the right adjustments for their family.

“Transitioning into the DDD services and into a paid, full-time caregiver was a very smooth and stress free process,” Debbie said. “Ability360 made it as easy on me as possible.”

Several trainings and certifications were done online at her own convenience, with someone available to answer any questions she had. Thanks to the caregiving position, Debbie and her daughter’s quality of life improved and they were not nearly as overwhelmed, giving them more time to focus on their relationship as a family.

Kaitlyn is very outdoorsy, and loves to participate in kayaking, fishing, swimming and other outdoor recreation.

“We spend more time doing recreation, social activities that bring joy to her life,” she said.

Debbie is also glad that she can be the primary caregiver for Kaitlyn.

“I know Kaitlyn’s medical history, I know what she likes and doesn’t like,” said Debbie. “It’s just wonderful for someone that knows the individual so well and has that history together to be the provider.”

If people want to become caregivers themselves, Debbie noted how Ability360 is an excellent resource.

“I’ve been so pleased with everything Ability360 has done to support me, to support Kaitlyn. Anytime I need a question answered [or] I need assistance with something, there’s always someone I can call,” Debbie said.

“I just feel secure knowing that Ability360 is in our back pocket.”
